Why Bible Institutes?

It has ever been recognized that those who are called to serve God in some special way require special training. In the long history of God's people on earth, various methods of providing such training have been used, but in one way or another all have been trained.

Sometimes God, without the use of human instrumentality, has been the instructor of His servants, as in the case of Moses and the prophets, and notably in the case of the apostles, who were trained by the Master Himself. But this is extraordinary. Generally the servants of God are trained by other servants, according to the principle set down by the apostle Paul in 2 Tim. 2: 2—"The things which thou hast heard of me . . . the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

One of the means to this end today are the Bible Institutes, so evidently raised up of God to meet the need of trained workers both for home and foreign service.

Ministry of Winnipeg Bible Institute

The Winnipeg Bible Institute is founded for the express purpose of preparing young men and women for the various types of Christian service. It holds strictly to the distinctive doctrines of the Gospel, such as: the full authority of the Scriptures as the very Word of God; the perfect Deity and Humanity of the Lord Jesus Christ; the substitutionary character of His sufferings and death upon the cross; His literal bodily resurrection, ascension, and coming again; individual regeneration by the Holy Spirit, and salvation through the atoning blood of Christ; and the responsibility of every believer so to live and witness that the interests of our Lord shall be advanced among men.

The Institute is interdenominational in spirit, and welcomes into its student body any person who truly loves the Lord Jesus Christ and desires to prepare in any way to serve Him more effectively, whether as pastor, missionary, evangelist, Sunday School teacher, or personal worker.

The fees of the Institute are kept to the lowest possible figure so that no worthy student may be excluded. The larger part of the cost of a student's training is met by means of the gifts of Christian people who are moved by the Spirit of God to contribute to the work.

Course of Study

Our Standard Bible Course requires three years to complete, and leads to the Diploma of the Institute. The subjects which will be taught in the 1941-1942 sessions are as follows:

1. Bible Synthesis — Genesis to Esther.
2. Bible Exposition — Selected Books.
3. Systematic Theology (Bible Doctrine).
4. Spiritual Life.
5. Dispensational Truth.
6. Biblical Introduction.
7. Bible History.
8. Church History.
9. Public Speaking.
10. Homiletics and Sermon Analysis.
11. Teacher Training Subjects.
12. Vacation Bible Schools.
13. English Grammar and Composition
(When needed).
14. Christian Missions.
15. Personal Evangelism.
16. Practical Christian Work.
17. Notation and Harmony.
18. School Chorus.

In addition to the above course of study we offer a one-year course to students whose education is limited, and this is designed to prepare them to take the Standard Bible Course.
