Graduation Completion Rates:

According to ABHE's Policy and Procedures for Monitoring Annual Report Data, an acceptable graduation rate is 25%.

College (Undergraduate) Graduation Rates: Following ABHE accreditation guidelines, completion rates are calculated based on the number of full-time undergraduate students who entered a program six years earlier and who completed their program within 150% of the expected time required for a full-time student to complete all requirements for graduation (for example, six years to complete a four-year degree).

Seminary (Graduate) Graduation Rates: Since most graduate students are part-time students, completion rates are calculated based on the number of students (part-time and full-time) who completed their program within 200% of the expected time required for a full-time student to complete all requirements for graduation (for example, four years to complete a two-year degree).

Retention Rates:

According to ABHE's Policy and Procedures for Monitoring Annual Report Data, an acceptable retention rate is 25%.
