Graduation Completion and Persistence Rates

According to ABHE's Policy and Procedures for Monitoring Annual Report Data and ATS's Policy on Maintaining Accreditation, an acceptable graduation rate is 25%.

College (Undergraduate) Graduation Rates: Following ABHE accreditation guidelines, completion rates are calculated based on the number of full-time undergraduate students who entered a program six years earlier and who completed their program within 150% of the expected time required for a full-time student to complete all requirements for graduation (for example, six years to complete a four-year degree).

Seminary (Graduate) Graduation Rates: Following ATS accreditation guidelines, since a high percentage of graduate students are part-time students, completion rates are calculated based on the number of students (part-time and full-time) who completed a degree program (excludes graduate certificate or diploma programs) within 200% of the expected time required for a full-time student to complete all requirements for graduation (for example, four years to complete a two-year degree). Since Horizon Seminary has ongoing enrollment during the academic year, this graduation rate reflects those who began during the spring, fall, or winter semesters.

Seminary (Graduate) Persistence Rate: ATS uses the term "persistence rate" to indicate those who those who already graduated with any degree (that is, those included in the graduation rate) plus those who are still enrolled in the seminary. Since Horizon Seminary has ongoing enrollment during the academic year, this persistence rate reflects those who began during the spring, fall, or winter semesters.
